We Came to Party: How Legal ARE Weed and 'Shrooms in Colorado? CLE

This 90-minute presentation by Attorney Rachael Ardanuy will provide a high-level overview of current Colorado law governing permissible personal use of cannabis and psilocybin mushrooms, related limitations on individuals' rights, and how personal medical and recreational use laws impact other legal practice areas, such as employment, American with Disability Act accommodation compliance, real estate, land use, landlord/tenant, family law, criminal defense, and estate planning and probate.

This course will also provide an overview of the Colorado's highly-regulated commercial Natural Medicine Program commencing soon. Attorney Ardanuy will also lead an ethics discussion on the intersection of marijuana legalization, the Natural Medicine Health Act, and the effect of Colorado's Rules of Professional Conduct on the acts and obligations of attorneys.
